Learning Outcomes

HONR 320E Art of Inquiry: Research and Capstone Seminar (or an approved departmental methods course. See your Honors advisor for other courses that may fulfill this requirement.) 3

Capstone Honors Project. See your Honors advisor about arranging senior Honors capstone project. The honors capstone is an original piece of scholarly or creative work completed under the direction of a faculty mentor and relevant to the students' academic and professional interests and aspirations. 3

Portfolio. DHC students also complete an e-portfolio documenting achievement of honors learning outcomes.

Graduating as a University Scholar

Students wishing to graduate with University Scholar distinction must complete the curricular requirements above at a 3.0 cumulative grade point average. Students complete a DHC application for graduation, in addition to their UM graduation application. University Scholars are awarded the Davidson Honors College Medallion which is presented at a special ceremony prior to University Commencement. 'University Scholar' is noted on their diplomas.

Admission to the DHC

Incoming students should apply to the Davidson Honors College as a supplement to their University of Montana application. This application receives a holistic review of materials including transcripts, short-answer responses, and optional test scores and letter of recommendation. Incoming students who apply by the first Friday in December will be considered for Davidson Honors College Scholarships.

Current University of Montana students who wish to enroll as a student in the Davidson Honors College complete a separate application available on the college's website.

Advising

Students in the Davidson Honors College receive supplemental advising support from the DHC. All students are assigned an honors advisor who assists them with planning for and implementing their honors requirements, alongside those of their academic major(s), minor(s), and certificates. Major and program specific advising is facilitated by the students' primary academic advisor. In addition, the DHC offers support for students in areas such as career development, undergraduate research, and pursuit of externally-funded scholarships and fellowships.

Opportunities for Involvement

The DHC is home to an active Honors Student Association, a team of honors Learning Assistants, DHC Ambassadors, and Honors Living and Learning Community, and a Dean's Student Advisory Council. Honors students are also involved across the university in student government, as athletes, artists, and performers, as servants of the community, and as leaders in a wide-range of departmental, college, and special interest organizations. The college hosts activities each year designed to build community, prepare students for their academic and professional aspirations, and to add value to and to elevate, enrich, and enliven their undergraduate experiences at UM.
