Course Requirements

- Students must complete at least 12 upper-division (300-level or above) credits.
- Special Topics courses taught at the 300- and 400-level (391 or 491) may count as upper-division area courses provided that they have a suitable content. Students should consult the department advisor and director of the Democracy Studies minor.
- The following credits requirements and limitations apply. Students must complete:
 - at least 6 credits in History (HSTA/HSTR), but no more than 9 credits.
 - · at least 3 credits in Philosophy (PHL), but no more than 9 credits.
 - at least 6 credits in Political Science (PSCI), but no more than 9 credits.
 - · no more than 6 credits in Business (BGEN/BMIS).
 - · no more than 6 credits in Environmental Studies (ENST).
 - · no more than 6 credits in Journalism (JRNL).
 - · no more than 6 credits in Non-Profit Administration (NPAD).
 - · no more than 3 credits in Public Health (PUBH).
 - no more than 6 credits in Sociology (SOCI).
