ASSOCIATE OF ARTS - GENERAL AA; BEHAVIORAL AND SOCIAL SCIENCES CONCENTRATION

Degree Specific Credits: 60

Required Cumulative GPA: 2.0

The Associate of Arts degree has the following general requirements. Students must:

- Complete all of the university's general education requirements (<http://catalog.umt.edu/academics/general-education-requirements/>) with the exception of the language requirement and the advanced writing requirement.
 - All courses taken to satisfy general education requirements must be taken for a traditional letter grade and must be passed with a grade of C- or better.
- Complete a minimum of 60 credits.
- Earn a minimum cumulative institutional GPA of 2.0.
- Complete at least 30 of the total 60 degree credits at Missoula College or UM-Missoula.

Missoula College students are limited to enrolling in lower-division (100- and 200-level) courses only.

To receive to Associate of Arts with a concentration in Behavioral and Social Sciences, a student must complete the requirements specific to the concentration listed below.
